2018 COMPOST AREA GUIDELINES

Chatham Township does not offer curbside pick-up. You must have a 2018 ORANGE permit to use the Tanglewood Lane Compost Area. Permits will be checked as you enter. One permit, per household, is available free to Chatham Township residents, after March 1st, upon proof of residency, at the following locations:

The residential permit is usable for a car or pick-up truck. If you intend to use a truck larger than a pick-up truck, owned or borrowed, you must receive prior permission for the specific date you intend to use the compost facility. For permission call the Public Works Department at 973-377-5114 and be prepared to give a description of the vehicle, the license plate number, and the date you will be coming to the Compost Area. A residential permit is not usable by your landscaper.

All Landscapers must contact the Public Works Department for purchase of compost permits at 973-377-5114. Compost is open to landscapers beginning April 3, 2018.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS: Grass Clippings, Leaves, Branches

NON-ACCEPTABLE MATERIAL: Building Materials, Rocks & Stones, Bio-degradable Bags, Railroad Ties, Concrete Stumps, Firewood, Plastic Bags

Whatever you bring your organic material in you must take back with you after unloading. Leaves and grass must be separated and loaded in the designated area. Branches must be separated from leaves and grass and placed in the brush pile. Branches must be no larger than 4 inches in diameter and 8 feet in length. The inclusion of non-acceptable materials leads to severe damage to expensive equipment used for the shredding of compost material and potential danger of physical harm to the compost operators.

Christmas Trees: When open, drop off trees at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling area or check with your garbage carrier.

SPRING MULCH AND COMPOST DELIVERY

The Department of Public Works, (DPW) will deliver 2.5-3 cubic yards of mulch to your driveway for a fee of **\$25/load**. Payment is by check only and must be remitted with order. Mulch orders must be placed in person at the DPW, 405 Southern Blvd., Mon-Thu, 8am-3 pm, in order to be scheduled for the next available delivery. This is done on a first come first served basis. Deliveries are done Friday mornings.

Mulch and Compost is **FREE** to town residents who wish to pick it up at the Compost area when it is officially open.

Appliances: Composed predominantly of metal. **Picked up at curbside the 2nd Wednesday of the month by Chatham Disposal 973-379-1268. Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water coolers** containing FREON MUST HAVE IT REMOVED BY A LICENSED COMPANY and ISSUED A STATE STICKER approving removal or the appliance will NOT be picked up. **For Freon removal:** Economy Appliance 973-635-5665, Par-Troy Sheet Metal & AC 973-227-1150. **Refrigerator-Freezer-A/C-Dehumidifiers Recycling Program:** Call **NJ Clean Energy** for free removal of working appliance 1-877-341-2192 or visit <http://www.njcleanenergy.com/refrigerator> to see if you qualify for a rebate. **Batteries:** Nickel Cadmium (Ni-CD), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium Ion (Li-Ion), Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn), Small Sealed Lead (SSLA/PB) are considered household hazardous waste and are found in cellular & cordless phones, laptops, cameras, remote controls, toys and cordless tools. Dispose of at Household Hazardous Waste Center or drop off events. Places accepting rechargeable batteries: Verizon Wireless, Lowe's, Radio Shack and Home Depot. Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006 accepts rechargeable and button batteries.

Cell Batteries: (alkaline and carbon zinc dry cell AAA, AA, C, D, AND 9V) are no longer considered hazardous. They may be thrown in the garbage.

Lead Acid Batteries: (car, boats, campers, etc.): Contact the Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006 or www.mcmua.com for drop off sites.

Fluorescent Light Bulbs, Ballasts, Mercury Switches & Thermostats: Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006. Parsippany Home Depot will take fluorescent bulbs and CFL's. 973-335-5917.

Paint: Latex: For partially full can add Kitty litter or shredded paper, stir and let dry completely. Put in regular trash with lid off. If the can is full pour excess in another can and follow the preceding instructions.

Paint (Oil based): Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006.

Plastic Bags: Return to your local grocery store and place in marked recycle bins.

- ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS**
- **Aerosol cans** (NOT EMPTY)
 - **Asbestos**-small quantities up to 100 lbs., wetted, double bagged & sealed with duct tape, NO SIDING
 - **Automotive fluids**-Antifreeze, Motor oil
 - Gasoline, Kerosene, Diesel Fuel
 - **Batteries**-Automotive, Motorcycle, Boat, Button Cell, Lithium, & Rechargeable
 - **Darkroom Chemicals**
 - **Driveway Sealant & Roofing Tar**
 - **E-waste**- Computers, Monitors, Printers, Hardware (mice, drives, keyboards, etc.), Scanners, Phones, Fax Machines, Stereos
 - **Fluorescent, HID Lamps & PCB Ballasts**
 - **Household Cleaning Products**
 - **Muriatic Acid**
 - **Mercury containing devices** – thermometers, thermostats, mercury switches, manometers
 - **Oil based paints, Stains, Lacquers & Varnishes**
 - **Paint thinners, Removers, & Solvents**
 - **Pesticides, Herbicides & Fertilizers**
 - **Pool Chemicals**
 - **Propane & Helium Cylinders** (BBQ sized & smaller)

- UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS**
- **Alkaline & Carbon Zinc Batteries**-These are non-hazardous and should be disposed of in the trash
 - **Business Waste**-These events are specifically for Morris County residential HHW. Business waste may be accepted at the MCMUA HHW facility. Please call 973-829-8006
 - **Drums of any material**-large quantities of waste must be transferred to 5 gal. pails prior to drop-off
 - **Empty Containers**-Once a material has been used up, put empty container in to the trash.
 - **Grout, Spackle & Joint Compound**-dispose in trash
 - **Highly Reactive or Unstable Materials**-Items such as benzoyl peroxide, chlorine (wet or gaseous), dioxane, ethers, ethyl nitrate, nitro compounds, phosphorous, picric acid, potassium perchlorate, pyridine, potassium and /or sodium metals, uranium/uranyl compounds, old chemistry sets, etc.
CALL (973)-829-8006 for approval prior to transporting any of these materials.
 - **Latex products**-These are non-hazardous, water based paints that should be dried out and disposed of in the trash. To dry out, remove the lid and add an absorbent material such as kitty litter or speedy dry to speed up the drying process. Once hardened and not in liquid form, throw the can into the trash with the lid off.
 - **Medical Waste**-Call the MCMUA at 973-829-8006 for more information
 - **Smoke Detectors**-Return to manufacturer listed on back
 - **Tires**- Not on rim. \$2.00 per tire Chatham Township Department of Public Works 973-377-5114.
 - **Unknown materials**-If unlabeled or unidentifiable, please call (973)-829-8006 for authorization to bring the material to the MCMUA HHW Disposal Program.

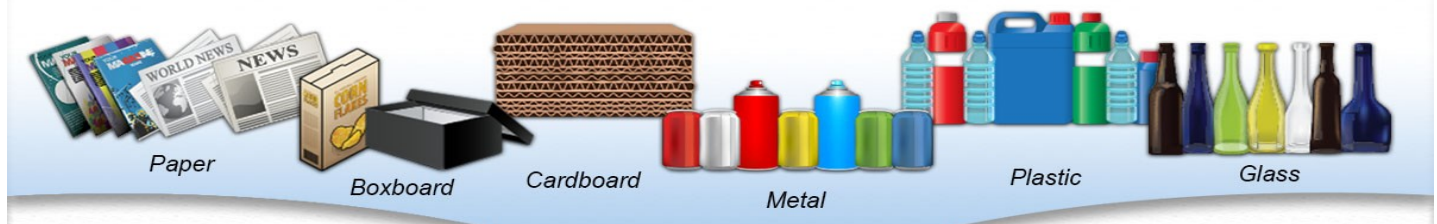

Single Stream Recycling



Office paper, file folders, junk mail, envelopes, paper backs, phone books, wrapping paper, newspaper, paper bags, magazines, catalogs, food boxes, juice & soup boxes, clean pizza boxes, clean ice cream containers, Corrugated cardboard must be flattened. Shredded paper in clear plastic bags ONLY!

Clean, empty, aluminum and steel (tin) cans, loose metal jar lids, steel bottle caps, aluminum foil, pie plates and trays.



Clean, empty, plastic containers coded: 1, 2, 4, 5 & 7. Plastic caps and lids larger than 3" in diameter are acceptable. The smallest plastic container is a 6 to 8 oz yogurt cup.

Clean, empty, glass bottles and jars, loose metal caps and lids.
