

TOWNSHIP OF CHATHAM
TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
May 22, 2014

Mayor Sullivan called the Regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Chatham to order at 7:35 PM.

Adequate Notice of this meeting of the Township Committee was given as required by the Open Public Meetings Act as follows: Notice was given to both The Chatham Courier and the Morris County Daily Record on January 6, 2014; notice was posted on the bulletin board in the main hallway of the Municipal Building on January 6, 2014; and notice was filed with the Township Clerk on January 6, 2014.

Mayor Sullivan led the Flag Salute.

Roll Call

Answering present to the roll call were Committeeman Gallop, Committeewoman Abbott, Deputy Mayor Ritter and Mayor Sullivan. Committeeman Brower arrived a few minutes late.

Approval of Agenda

Deputy Mayor Ritter moved to approve the Agenda. Committeewoman Abbott seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Reports

Committeewoman Abbott reported that Colony Pool will open on Memorial Day Weekend. The Community Garden has opened, and a ribbon cutting ceremony was held. 48% of the plots are being used by Township residents, with 52% being used by Borough residents.

Committeeman Gallop reported that the Police Department has recently installed plate readers in squad cars, and they have already been effective.

Committeeman Brower reported that the Senior Center has tickets available for the annual Garden Tour. He also reported that a new historical marker sign was erected in Green Village.

Deputy Mayor Ritter reported that the Environmental Commission will have a table at Fishawack Day. They are also still working on an upcoming survey regarding recycling. Additionally, the Morris County MUA will be conducting a household hazardous waste disposal event on May 31st from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Morris County Public Safety Training Academy. The Communications Committee is working on the June/July newsletter. Furthermore, the Township website has been updated with bios of the Township Committee members, and an email address has been created so that the public can send one email to the entire Township Committee all at once.

Mayor Sullivan reported that the Green Village Fire Department will be holding a Memorial Day service on Monday morning, and he encouraged residents to observe Memorial Day.

Administrator Ciccarone reported that if the bond ordinance on the agenda for this meeting is adopted, the Township will be able to move forward with the capital improvement program. He also noted that Colony Pool will be opening, and memberships are still available. Administrator Ciccarone also commented on the Southern Boulevard School Summer Camp.

Hearing of Citizens

Mayor Sullivan opened the Hearing of Citizens. Seeing no comment, Mayor Sullivan closed the Hearing of Citizens.

ORDINANCE 2014-10
BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF CHATHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$745,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Chatham, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Township of Chatham, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey (the "Township") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery in, by and for said Township, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Township.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

A. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery consisting of a diesel fuel vault for use at the Department of Public Works ("DPW") Yard.

B. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery consisting of mobile cameras for the use of the Police Department.

Period of Usefulness	5 years

C. Undertaking of improvements to various roads, as set forth on a list prepared or to be prepared by the Township Engineer and placed on file with the Township Clerk and hereby approved as if set forth herein in full. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Township Committee, there may be additions to or deletions from the aforesaid list. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

D. Undertaking of improvements to various public buildings, including, but not limited to, boiler repair and fire alarm upgrades at the Municipal Building and various improvements to Police Headquarters. It is hereby determined and stated that said public buildings to be improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law.

E. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery consisting of firefighting, emergency and safety equipment for the use of the Volunteer Fire Departments.

Bonds and Notes Authorized	\$ 47,500
Period of Usefulness	5 years

F. Undertaking of underground storage tank remediation at the DPW Yard.

Appropriation and Estimated Cost	\$ 25,000
Down Payment Appropriated	\$ 1,250
Bonds and Notes Authorized	\$ 23,750
Period of Usefulness	15 years

Aggregate Appropriation and Estimated Cost	\$745,000
Aggregate Down Payment Appropriated	\$ 37,250
Aggregate Amount of Bonds and Notes Authorized	\$707,750

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$35,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$37,250, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$37,250 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$707,750 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$707,750 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section,

the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Township and attested by the Township Clerk or Deputy Township Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 10.30 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of said Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$707,750 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Morris, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Township Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 14. The Township intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Township incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Township hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 15. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Township, and the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

Mayor Sullivan opened the Public Hearing on Ordinance 2014-10.
Seeing no public comment, Mayor Sullivan closed the Public Hearing.

Committeeman Gallop asked about the longest useful life of a project for which a municipality can bond. Administrator Ciccarone said that it would depend on the kind of project involved, and there are statutes governing bond law.

Committeeman Brower moved to adopt Ordinance 2014-10. Deputy Mayor Ritter seconded the motion.

To Fairmount Country Club, Inc., a private club for members only, for premises situated at 400 Southern Boulevard, Chatham Township, New Jersey (License # 1405-33-001-002).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to issue and deliver a plenary retail consumption license for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, as follows:

To CB Chatham LLC, for premises situated at 522 Southern Boulevard, Chatham Township, New Jersey (Lic. No. 1405-33-002-009).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution certified by the Township Clerk be forwarded to the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control and the State Department of Taxation and Finance, Newark, New Jersey, for their information and guidance.

Committeewoman Abbott noted that language could be removed from Resolution 2014-121 referring to permission from Green Acres, as it has been determined that such approval is not necessary for the shed.

Committeeman Brower commented on the benefits for Township employees listed in the employee handbook. Administrator Ciccarone indicated that some benefits are statutory, and some are subject to collective bargaining agreements. Furthermore, there are not any issues with abuse of sick time. He also said that there is a limited amount of sick time cash out allowable. Committeeman Brower said that benefits programs should be regularly reevaluated.

Committeeman Brower also asked about the shed to be installed at the Community Garden. Committeewoman Abbott said that the shed would be used for storage of tools. Administrator Ciccarone said that it would be a relatively small shed. Committeewoman Abbott added that there is not a waiting list for the Garden, and reiterated the membership breakdown.

Mayor Sullivan asked about the refunding of overpayment of taxes due to state judgment. Administrator Ciccarone said that the three in Resolution 2014-122 are one time refunds due to a tax court decision to reduce the properties’ assessments.

Deputy Mayor Ritter asked if he should recuse himself on Resolution 2014-123 as he is a member of the Fairmount Country Club.

Committeewoman Abbott moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Deputy Mayor Ritter seconded the motion.
